A 2<sup>nd</sup> video was of Andrea Bocelli performing last Easter. In the midst of the global pandemic and the lockdown of almost every nation, the city of Milan invited him to perform a live stream event from their cathedral. Inside the cathedral, with no one in attendance and accompanied only by the organ, Andrea began to sing several classical pieces. To conclude the concert, he walked down the aisle and went outside to the plaza in front of the cathedral. Normally, there would have been thousands of people gathered to celebrate Easter. Last year, however, there was no crowd and no noise.

Andrea stepped to the microphone and began to sing "Amazing Grace." I've probably heard that sung thousands of times but there was something different about this rendition. As he sang, the words seemed to be more powerful than ever. Mixed into the shots of him singing, were images of cities around the world. It was so eerie seeing those cities that would normally have been teeming with people, completely empty.

As Andrea sang, 3 lines jumped out at me. From verse one, *"was lost but now am found."* In verse two, *"and grace my fears relieved."* To conclude, he repeated verse one and another line jumped out, *"was blind, but now I see."* <u>Those 3 lines encapsulate....(cont. p.4)</u>

After an extensive revision of this extremely popular School of Practical Ministry (SOPM) training material, Evangel is thrilled to announce that we will offer Level I of the SOPM here in the U.S. for the first time since 2017. The School of Practical Ministry was initially developed by Evangel as a way to train lay people here in America, who didn't want to pursue a seminary degree. However, in 2009, this program was used to train pastors and church leaders overseas for the first time and since then, God has shifted our primary focus to this international training opportunity.

Now it's your turn, but this may be the only opportunity available to take this class for the foreseeable future. Class size will be limited and we will utilize the Zoom platform to teach the program, so you can actually reside anywhere in the continental U.S. and be able to participate.

## International SOPM Update

Although the effects of the Covid 19 pandemic have been more severe in developing nations, our ministry partners in Cameroon and Sierra Leone have continued to reach out to their respective nations to bring hope, peace and encouragement all while offering much needed humanitarian relief as well. We are humbled and grateful to have such great friends and co-workers in these ministries who are actively demonstrating the love of Christ on a daily basis.

As an example, in Sierra Leone, our ministry partner, Gethsemane Evangelical Ministries (GEM) has been providing food for people whose livelihood has been taken away through Covid lockdown policies. Because there is no "safety net" for these families, if they don't earn money, they don't eat. GEM has stepped in to help, even though they too have limited resources. In addition, GEM has seized the opportunity to RESCUE 57 women from Sierra Leone caught up in the sex traffic trade in a Middle Eastern country. They have brought these women back home and provided them with food, clothing, shelter and medical treatment while they minister healing to these ladies in Jesus name.

On the home front, we are pleased to report that the Board of Trustees for Evangel has agreed that some of the donations to Evangel for International Training will be sent to our partnering ministries to help provide much needed resources for the extraordinary work they are engaged in. **Thank you for helping to make this possible!**

.....<u>the essence of the Gospel and what Jesus accom-</u> <u>plished through his death and resurrection</u>. It was like, in the midst of all the craziness of last year, God broke through and said to a fearful world, "I'm still here. My love is greater than this. My Son died for you. He was resurrected and for all time destroyed the power of sin and death. Will you trust me?"

There are so many opportunities around us. The cities of Indianapolis, Kenosha, and Austin are reeling from horrific mass shootings. As I write this, there is a humanitarian crisis at our southern border. Almost 600,000 families are grieving the loss of a loved one who succumbed to the Covid virus. Others have lost their jobs. Business owners have lost their businesses. People are living in fear and loneliness and discouragement and despair.

Unfortunately, many of us who are followers of Jesus have become distracted by peripheral issues. However, we are seeing a new day and it's time to refocus. The writer of Hebrews tells us what we need to do. *Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a huge crowd of witnesses to the life of faith, let us strip off every weight that slows us down, especially the sin that so easily trips us up.* And let us run with endurance the race God has *set before us. We do this by keeping our eyes on Jesus, the champion who initiates and perfects our faith.* (Heb. 12:1,2).

Jesus addressed this situation. You know the saying, "Four months between planting and harvest." But I say, wake up and look around. The fields are already ripe for harvest. (John 4:35). He is clearly saying that the time is now. We used to think we had plenty of time to reach out to others. <u>Covid has clearly shown us that there is</u> <u>now immediacy to life. Tomorrow isn't guaranteed. We</u> <u>need to be about our Father's business today.</u> Paul told the Ephesian believers to live their lives differently. So be careful how you live. Don't live like fools, but like those who are wise. Make the most of every opportunity in these evil days. Don't act thoughtlessly, but understand what the Lord wants you to do. (Eph. 5:15-17). You can read all about our host ministries in Cameroon and Sierra Leone taking advantage of opportunities God has presented to them. (see International SOPM p.3)

In his 2<sup>nd</sup> letter to the Corinthian Church, Paul talks about what should be our motivation. *Either way, Christ's love controls us.* (II Cor. 5:14). The overwhelming love of God that we have experienced, should catapult us out of our lethargy and comfort zones.

Jesus is our example. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them because they were confused and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. He said to his disciples, "The harvest is great, but the workers are few. So pray to the Lord who is in charge of the harvest; ask him to send more workers into his fields." (Matt. 9:37,38). Our prayer shouldn't just be, God send someone. Instead it should be God send me.

What an incredible responsibility we have been given. Now more than ever people need to hear the magnificent message of "Amazing Grace." Because of what Jesus has done, those who are lost can be found. Those living in fear can have those fears relieved by God's overwhelming grace. Those who are spiritually blind can have their sight restored. They just need someone to show them. Are we going to be the ones to do that or will we continue to sit on the sideline hoping that someone else will jump in. It's my heart's desire that we will once again be people of action who live out the Gospel in our neighborhoods, communities, cities, and nation. Let it be so Lord!
